

#### PREFACE.

THE present volume is intended as a contribution to what may be justily considered a not unimportant department of our national song literature—the Nursery Rhymes namely, which seem appointed, by tack and universal consent, to be "said or sung," and to be listened to, with unwearied interval and appreciation, in those great National Institutions, the British Nursery and Home Schoolroom. To all who are interested in the selection of books for children the book is now offered by the Dubbles, with the hope that it may gain general and extended approbation. Especial pains have been taken to secure the sufface of that still larger public, in petitiousts and batches, becomes genial English writer of the last century, who loved children, and spoke and wrote of them with infinite tenderness and affection, describes as "masters in all the learning on the other side of eight years old;"

and my LAUV WIND, are real and distinct entities in the mind of very little child whose nursery education has not been entirely and unwarrantably neglected; and therefore it has seemed good to the Publishers to present to the children of the present day the adventures of those heroes, embellished with whetever plotoid illustration, careful selection, musical accompaniment, and the advantages of artistic typegraphy and detail can contribute, to render them more acceptable to all English children.

In the arrangement of the musical portion of the volume, especial care has been taken by Mr. ELLIOTT to keep the songs strictly within the capacity of children's execution, and the compass of children's wices. In his own family he has found a young jury ready to text the various tunes, and has chosen only those melodies which found prompt acceptance, were easily remembered, and came trippingly off the tongue.

The pictorial illustrations of the book have been designed under the superintendence of, and engraved by, the BROTHERS DALZIEL.

Among the old favourites a few new aspirants to popularity will be found; but it is hoped that their presence will be considered an additional attraction, and in no way lessen the pretensions of the present volume to be considered a compendium of National Nursery Rhymes.







When the composer has set the dialogue to recitative, the same will be included in this edition, when he has intended portions of the drama to be spoken, such passages will be printed in their proper place.

An English translation, written by Madame Macfarren, will be printed together with the original words, whether German, French, or Italian. This plan has been adopted since, although the latter language is conventionally associated with operation usic, accepted Italian versions often depart widely from the sense of the original; moreover the syllabic arrangement is frequently so much changed as materially to alter the phrasing. The sole aim of the elitor's translation being to follow the original as closely as possible in all respects, no other translation could be printed beside it without causing troublesome discrepancies in the distribution of notes.

The composer's directions for phrasing and expression will be strictly adhered to, on the authority of the best accredited scores, and all interpolations, omissions, and alterations of these will be rejected. In this respect the present edition will be unique among those that have hitherto appeared in this country.
